In the service outlined for Ash Wednesday in the Book of Common worship, the pastor is invited to make this statement:

Friends in Christ, every year at the time of the Christian Passover (Easter) we celebrate our redemption through the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. Lent is a time to prepare for this celebration and to renew our lives in this holy mystery. We begin this season by acknowledging our need for repentance, and for the mercy and forgiveness proclaimed in the gospel of Jesus Christ. We begin our journey to Easter with the sign of ashes. This ancient sign speaks of the frailty and uncertainty of human life, and mark the penitence of this community.



We hope you will join your friends in Christ at our Ash Wednesday service, on **March 6 at 6:30 pm** in the sanctuary. You will hear the Word proclaimed, and have the opportunity to be marked with ashes as you begin your own Lenten journey to the empty cross.

Much of the ministry of the church of Jesus Christ takes place in the household and family of God. Nurture and spiritual growth, worship and the care for God's children are vital aspects of our lives together. A line in our Sunday worship bulletin reminds us that we "Gather for Worship." There is another line near the end of the order of worship, reminding us that "We Depart to Serve." This dual focus, both inward and outward, is important as God's people serve God in their daily lives.

As a member congregation of the Presbyterian Church (USA), we view our mission field as being our local community, our state and nation, and God's world.

Locally, the members of First Presbyterian Church reach out beyond our walls through our Deacons' Fund, and the sharing of time and talent with Meals on Wheels, Family Emergency Services, Habitat for Humanity, Girls INC, Angels Care Center, and The Mission, to mention just a few. Our deacons also coordinate our Saturday Night Soup Kitchen, the Bag Lunch Ministry and Saturday Nite Live (with developmentally and physically disabled adults). In each of these ministries, those who make up the body of Christ at First Presbyterian Church share time, talents, and treasures with the world in the name of Lord.



Beyond our city, we support the work of the Presbytery of Tampa Bay. In this mission partnership, new churches are being organized and disciples are being nurtured in Central Florida at the Cedarkirk Camp and Conference Center, Beth-El Farmworker Ministry, and the Campus Ministry at Eckerd College.

Our church also sends mission teams to Honduras through the mission partnership between with Presbytery of Honduras and the Presbytery of Tampa Bay, and supports mission partners in Africa, Taiwan, Brazil, and Thailand.

Nationally and internationally, along with over 10,000 other PC (USA) congregations, people are being trained and supported in ministry, and mission personnel are blanketing the globe with the gospel of Jesus Christ. Our church's commitment to justice for all God's people for the year 2019 includes our shared ministry in Presbytery, Synod, and General Assembly Mission, the local benevolent work through our Deacons, and pastoral services of our pastors as they help coordinate and interpret mission for our church.

The tithes and offerings of the members and friends of our church helps us to care for God's people here and around the world. Thanks for all that YOU do to help us do what WE do as Christ's church.





Return Service Requested

In Tribute to the Rev. Dr. James G. Manor



Dr. Jim Manor died at the Florida Presbyterian Homes in Lakeland on February 9, 2019, at the age of 100. He served as the Interim Pastor of our church on three separate occasions.

In 1990, when long-tenured First Pres Pastor Dr. Don Price was granted a six month sabbatical leave, Dr. Manor came and offered pastoral leadership to our congregation. Less than two years later, when Dr. Price retired, Dr. Jim Manor returned as Interim Pastor to help our congregation say good-bye to our longest serving pastor, and to say hello to new opportunities in our second century of ministry and mission. Two years after his second interim with us, Dr, Manor returned for a third time (his "third coming") to help our congregation in transition between the pastorates of Steve Bryant and Steve Negley.

Jim and Ann Manor's calm, confident, Christ-centered presence were a blessing to First Presbyterian Church of Winter Haven for decades. The Manor Conference Room in our church office was dedicated in April 1996 in recognition of their service in helping our church in times of transition. Our congregation will be forever grateful to these servants of Jesus Christ for their ministry in our midst.

A memorial service for Dr. James G. Manor is being planned for **11:00 am on Saturday**, April 6, 2019, here in our sanctuary. We hope that you will come and celebrate the life of this saint with his family and friends.
