Christmas My Favorite ^ Things



While I have enjoyed *The Sound of Music* for years, I have often wondered how one song, *My Favorite Things* was adopted into the collection of Christmas songs. Obviously the references to "brown paper packages tied up with strings," "crisp apple strudel," and "sleigh bells" reminded many people of the holidays and so it became a standard in the Christmas music library. I was inspired by it and thought the insertion of "Christmas" would be an appropriate theme for the 2018 Advent Devotional.

A *theme* for the 2018 Advent Devotional was previously announced, but it seems too narrow and restrictive so "My Favorite Christmas Things" will not exclude those who had already thought of a dish and recipe that might be included. The dish, "Tomato Gravy," the recipe for it, and how it came to be a part of Christmas Breakfast might be an interesting story. Your recipe for your grandmother's cornbread dressing and the good time you had observing her or helping her make it would also be welcome. The Peppermint Stick Ice Cream Pie and instructions for making it might entice others to conclude their holiday meal with this dessert so that it becomes a Christmas Eve tradition in their household.

Among other favorite Christmas things that might be of interest to our readers are articles of clothing. Your Associate Pastor dons Christmas ties yearly that were given him by family members of Ray Golden and Bill Ross. Do you have an ugly sweater that has become holiday garb you enjoy wearing?



Your favorite things might be homemade decorations or ornaments that were made when you were a child, a scout or taking a craft class. A dear friend may have made a special decoration or ornament for you.




CIRCLE MEETINGS


11:00 a.m. Sanctuary Worship

SUNDAY SCHOOL FOR ALL AGES

For Kids: We'll be getting to learn more about Jesus - His life and ministry and leaders in the early church. Short videos, music, art, and Bible activities will keep the kids coming back for more!

If your family attends the 9:30 a.m. service, kids age 4 and older worship with their families for the first part of the service. After the "Time with Younger Disciples," age 4 through grade 5 may be dismissed to the Christian Education building for music and classes until 10:45 a.m.

If your family attends the 11:00 a.m. service, come to the CE Building for music and classes from 10:00 until 10:45 a.m.

For Adults: Who is the real Jesus? How can we experience the mystery, complexity, and richness of his spirituality and teachings in our lives today? *Living Jesus: Learning the Heart of the Gospel* by Luke Timothy Johnson elucidates the mystery of Jesus' resurrection and its central role in the Christian experience. It explores the diversity and fullness of the New Testament views of Christ, revealing how each book's perspective can deepen our understanding of Jesus.
