A CONFIRMATION JOURNEY

We celebrate an important point in faith with 14 young people in our congregation, Confirmation. This is unique group as it includes our confirmation classes from both 2020 and 2021. The pandemic interrupted this experience for last year's group. They had to meet via Zoom for the majority of their time together. In 2021, we started with our next group and fortunately, we were able to bring both classes together for our Confirmation Retreat serving as a capstone for this important journey. It was a joy to walk with both these classes as they explored their faith.

On each Wednesday afternoon, several of our church's sixth, seventh, and eighth grade youth – Landon Allen, Lydia Badnell, Drew Fenley, Jackson Gainey, Brianna Hunter, Remy Jacobson, Jenna Johnston, Grady Martin, Chloe Miller, Ellisande Nowroozi, Taige Nowroozi, Brayden Olmert, Drew Powell, & Camryn Swango joined with our pastor, Dr. Negley, and church members Connie Shipley and Susan Singleton, for an exploration of faith. Early on, each young person was presented a new Bible from the congregation of First Presbyterian Church. These compact, hardcover New International Version student Bibles contain a wealth of study aids suited for believers of this age. Three weeks of our Confirmation training were spent "shaking hands with the Bible."

As our months of meetings unfolded, we discussed the Christian year, the history of the Christian church and the PC(USA), worship, and personal faith. We also conducted a historical scavenger hunt around the church property, and looked at our church's confessions as we studied some banners and climbed to our church's secret hiding place. We made stoles that help express our faith in symbols. The young people selected six symbols with which to adorn these.

One of our Confirmation highlights was our Retreat. This year included our two classes from 2020 & 2021. From 6:00 pm on Friday, May 21 to 6:00 pm on Saturday, May 22, our group along with Steve and Connie, were marvelously busy. After climbing the steeple and enjoying an "organ crawl" hosted by Jeremy Rath, our Director of Music Ministries, we started work on writing individual statements of faith. Each Confirmand was invited to respond in writing to the prompt "To me God is …" In this newsletter you will find excerpts from the statements of faith that each of these young people composed during Confirmation. (The full copies of their statements of faith are posted on a bulletin board in McLeod Hall.)

The confirmation retreat also included an early morning trip to Publix where we shopped for food for the Saturday Soup Kitchen. For the last four hours of the 24 hour retreat, families of the Confirmands joined us as we prepared and served the meal for our Saturday Soup Kitchen.

Finally, on June 2 our young people were invited to meet with the Elders of our church. The conversation that night revolved around what we believe. The Session members read the statements of faith, and then joined them in responding to the questions which form the basis for membership in our church: Is Jesus Christ your Lord and Savior? Do you trust Him? Do you intend to be His disciple, to obey His Word, and to show His love?

Please pray for these young people as they continue in their life of discipleship.

Save this number as a contact for future giving.

Keywords are:

Pledged (for your offering to be credited to your pledged amount for the current year)

Offering (Non-pledge or undesignated gifts)

Music (for Capital Music Campaign Organ/Music)

3cents (for 3 Cents-a-Meal)

Memorial (for when donating in memory of someone)

Special (for all other donations; example 1 time events)

If you are donating through Text To Give for the first time, you will receive a text containing a link to login or create your Secure Give account. Please save that login information.

You will then be asked to save your default payment information for giving by text. The system will confirm your donation and you will receive an email receipt.

The only time that you should have to enter your login or card information is the first time you donate through Text to Give. After your first transaction, your Secure Give account and card information will be recognized automatically and you will simply reply **Y**.

The next time you would like to give by text, simply type the keyword and amount to the number above and you will receive a request to confirm with **Y**.
