




THE MARCH SATURDAY NITE LIVE HAS A SPECIAL TIME AND PLACE

NEW PERSPECTIVES SUNDAY SCHOOL STUDY BEGINS APRIL 14

This class will be studying "Man's Search For Meaning," a book by Dr. Viktor Frankl to guide discussion. Dr. Frankl and his family were sent to a Nazi concentration camp in 1942. There he would experience the death of his pregnant wife, both parents and brother. From that experience, he, as a psychiatrist, focused on human suffering. He reminds us that while we cannot avoid suffering, we can choose how to cope with suffering and even find meaning in the midst of our suffering, while we move forward with renewed purpose. Our own faith will also guide this discussion-oriented class whose share leadership welcomes you to join them at 9:30 am in the Geneva Room.


SPECIAL SUNDAY SCHOOL PRESENTATION
