PERSPECTIVES SUNDAY SCHOOL STUDY HAS BEGUN



This class is studying *Man's Search For Meaning*, a book by Dr. Viktor Frankl to guide discussion. Dr. Frankl and his family were sent to a Nazi concentration camp in 1942. There he would experience the death of his pregnant wife, both parents and brother. From that experience, he, as a psychiatrist, focused on human suffering. He reminds us that while we cannot avoid suffering, we can choose how to cope with suffering and even find meaning in the midst of our suffering, while we move forward with renewed purpose.

Our own faith will also guide this discussion-oriented class whose shared leadership welcomes you to join us at 9:30 am in the Geneva Room.

We want to continue to be able to meet the need for the prayer shawls so your help will be greatly appreciated! Call the church office at 294-3121 if you have questions.



A Confirmation Journey

Today, we celebrate an important point in faith with 8 young people in our congregation, Confirmation.

On each Wednesday afternoon from mid-January through the end of April, several of our church's sixth, seventh, and eighth grade youth – Audrey Bolin, McKenzie Cinquanti, Mia Cinquanti, Sarah Dugger, Calen Nowroozi, Carley Rabern, Lucy Schwartz, & Sawyer Speer joined with our pastor, Dr. Negley, and church members Connie Shipley and Susan Singleton, for an exploration of faith. Early on, each young person was presented a new Bible from the congregation of First Presbyterian Church. These compact, hardcover New International Version student Bibles contain a wealth of study aids suited for believers of this age. Three weeks of our Confirmation training were spent "shaking hands with the Bible."

As our months of meetings unfolded, we discussed the Christian year, the history of the Christian church and the PC(USA), worship, and personal faith. We also conducted a historical scavenger hunt around the church property, and looked at our church's confessions as we studied some banners and climbed to our church's secret hiding place. We made stoles that help express our faith in symbols. (Our thanks go out to Dana Elmore, who has sewn these beautiful stoles again this year for our Confirmands.) The young people selected six symbols with which to adorn these. They are wearing their stoles today.


One of our Confirmation hi-lights was our Retreat. From 6:00 pm on Friday, April 6 to 6:00 pm on Saturday, April 7, our group along with Steve, Susan, Shipley, and Amy Speer were **marvelously busy.** After climbing the steeple and an "organ crawl" hosted by Lynn McCoy, our Director of Music Ministries, we started work on writing individual statements of faith. Each Confirmand was invited to respond in writing to the prompt "To me God is ..." On the other side of this insert, you will find excerpts from the statements of faith that each of these young people composed during Confirmation. (The full copies of their statements of faith are posted on a bulletin board in McLeod Hall.)

The confirmation retreat also included an early morning trip to Publix where we shopped for food for the Saturday Soup Kitchen. For the last four hours of the 24 hour retreat, families of the Confirmands joined us as we prepared and served the meal for our Saturday Soup Kitchen.

Finally, on April 24 our young people were invited to share a meal with the Elders of the church. The conversation that night revolved around what we believe. The Session members read the statements of faith, and then joined them in responding to the questions which form the basis for membership in our church: Is Jesus Christ your Lord and Savior? Do you trust Him? Do you intend to be His disciple, to obey His Word, and to show His love?


