

The last day for Sunday School before the summer worship schedule begins is May 26.


Be on the look-out for NEW educational opportunities this summer.

PERSPECTIVES SUNDAY SCHOOL STUDY HAS BEGUN



This class is studying *Man's Search For Meaning*, a book by Dr. Viktor Frankl to guide discussion. Dr. Frankl and his family were sent to a Nazi concentration camp in 1942. There he would experience the death of his pregnant wife, both parents and brother. From that experience, he, as a psychiatrist, focused on human suffering. He reminds us that while we cannot avoid suffering, we can choose how to cope with suffering and even find meaning in the midst of our suffering, while we move forward with renewed purpose.

Our own faith will also guide this discussion-oriented class whose shared leadership welcomes you to join us at 9:30 am in the Geneva Room.

It's that time of year again when flocks of flamingos begin mysteriously arriving in the yards of unsuspecting church members.
