

CHRIST KIDS HAS BEGUN!





As First Press members you should know


A Ledger article appearing August 9th mentioned that First Presbyterian Church of Winter Haven was still owed \$185,490.46 at the time Stephen L. Smith's probation was terminated. (Mr. Smith's probation and restitution were from incidents related to a fraudulent enterprise in the 1980's known as SH Oil). Some readers may have drawn the understandable but erroneous conclusion that our church had been an investor. Please be assured that First Presbyterian Church never invested a dime in Mr. Smith's company. However, a congregant who had been an investor and who had been awarded a judgment against Smith, bequeathed to our church a portion of his estate, which included that judgment. The State Attorney's office has advised us to record the final judgment in the (unlikely) event that adequate additional assets controlled by Mr. Smith should be located over the next twenty years. Over the course of the past decade the church has received ten or twenty dollars a year representing our portion of funds that Smith had sent to probation authorities. We have used this money in our Feed the Hungry ministry.

As members, we want you to rest assured in our church's management of the financial gifts entrusted to our care. Please share this information with any of your friends or acquaintances who might have been confused by what was originally printed in the Ledger.


EMBRACING: FORGIVENESS WITH BARBARA CAWTHORNE CRAFTON – ROOM 207

The Session is excited to announce the calling of Emily Snyder as our NEW DIRETCOR OF STUDENT MINISTRIES.
