EMBRACING: FORGIVENESS WITH BARBARA CAWTHORNE CRAFTON – ROOM 207

Join Bill Lockhart and videos with Barbara Cawthorne Crafton as we study embracing forgiveness - beginning with clarity that eases the guilt often associated with the lack of forgiveness by saying what it isn't. It is not a job or task; it is not a conditional act to earn God's love. It is, Crafton believes, a spiritual gift given freely by a God who simply wants to connect with us. Over the five-week study, she shows how forgiveness can remove the tumor of anger from our hearts to become a means of grace that gives back our humanity.
