


BRIGHT SUNDAY BUTTERFLY RELEASE

Over a period of three and a half years, the Presbyterian Committee on Congregational Song met regularly to sing, discuss, and consider thousands of hymns and songs to be included in the new Presbyterian hymnal. In 2012, the new hymnal was presented to the General Assembly and it was commended for use within the church. In late 2013, the hymnals were printed and began to be used in worship. After thorough discussion and consideration, the Session of First Presbyterian Church of Winter Haven has adopted the new

THE PRESBYTERIAN HYMNAL Presbyterian Hymnal Glory to God for use in worship.

QUICK FACTS

- Glory to God contains 853 hymns, compared to 605 of the current Blue hymnal.
- 65% of the Blue hymnal is in *Glory to God*; which basically means, if there is a hymn you like in the Blue hymnal... it's in *Glory to God*.
- The 65% of the Blue hymnal only constitutes 50% of the new hymnal.
- This means there are over 400 new hymns in the Glory to God!

To raise the funds necessary for *Glory to God*, the Session has approved the selling of dedications for each hymnal. Each dedication will be attached to the inside cover of the hymnal and will cost\$20.

"What about the Blue hymnals?"

• If you or your family purchased a Blue hymnal dedication, you will be encouraged to take that hymnal home after *Glory to God* is adopted in mid-April. The Worship and Music Committee will be labeling all the blue hymnals for pick-up.

We hope that you will consider purchasing a hymnal in honor or in memory of a loved one. Please fill out the forms below and return them to the office.

Celebrating Generosity with Middle School Youth Group Dinners

Every Wednesday night in the youth house there is anywhere between 25-35 middle school students playing games, hanging out with friends, and learning more about Jesus Christ. Our meetings are structured with times for lessons, games, fellowship, and dinner. Youth group starts at 5:30 pm, and after a long day of school, it is part of our ministry to provide our students with a hot meal. In the past, these dinners have been provided solely by the parents. However, this school year, our middle school youth group has more than doubled in size, and bringing food for that many students can be time and money consuming for the same parents week after week. To feed the number of students we have costs anywhere between \$70-\$100 every week.

Recently, we have experienced overwhelming generosity in helping provide dinner for our youth group meetings. We have had church committees and members of the congregation join together to cook and prepare dinner for our students. We have had members charitably give us a money donation to help offset the cost of purchasing these meals. And, because of your generosity, the Session was able to allocate a budget specifically for youth group dinners. Thank you so much for your giving. Because we have so many generous people in our church family, we are able to continue this important aspect of youth ministry. When our students come on Wednesday night, they know they will get to play games, spend time with friends, enjoy an awesome meal, and build a closer relationship with Jesus. 

HYMNS FROM GLORY TO GOD

Isaac Watts (1674-1748) is considered the "Father of English Hymnody" and he wrote nearly 750 hymns, including Joy to the World and Alas! and Did My Savior Bleed. Over the past four centuries, the stories behind these songs have been lost to history. However, the stories of how his hymns have touched lives have remained.

One story involves a 19th century missionary named John Vassar. He had the habit of going from house to house to hand out pamphlets telling people about Jesus. In reaction to having a door slammed in his face by a woman, Vassar wearily sat down on her doorstep and began singing Isaac Watts' Alas! and Did My Savior Bleed. Upon hearing the words of the hymn, the woman opened the door, opened her home to Vassar, and opened her heart to Jesus.

A second story involves another famous hymn writer. Despite her blindness, Fanny Crosby became one of the most prolific hymn writers in recent history writing more than 8000 hymns, including *Blessed Assurance*. In 1851, Crosby attended a revival meeting, and it was while the congregation sang the last line of *Alas! and Did My Savior Bleed* that Fanny prayed the words of the hymn "Here Lord, I give myself away..." and found herself a changed woman.

Watts' hymn Alas! and Did My Savior Bleed has touched many lives and had a long history with Presbyterian hymnals, first appearing in 1823. *Glory to God* retains this history so that lives will continue to be touched and changed.


Preschool Children – Meet in Room 108 for their very own time of Bible stories, craft, and snack time.




