LAST CHANCE TO SIGN UP FOR KIDS SUMMER ESCAPE




This is your LAST opportunity to register for Kidz Summer Escape!!! We need to know if your child/children will be joining us BY MAY 1.



Generosity Shows Through Summer Children's Programs at First Presbyterian Church

Just because summertime is quickly approaching doesn't mean our Christian Education programs for children takes a vacation, in fact, it's quite the opposite.

We offer several programs for our children as well as children from the community to participate in.

Kidz Summer Escape is a program which was established at least 12 years ago and includes children ages three through kindergarten graduates. They meet on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 8:30 a.m. - 1 p.m. and each week focus on a fun theme. They enjoy crafts, outdoor play, snacks, movies, and so much more. A donation of \$170 helps to cover the cost of this program, with a \$50 "reserve my spot" due by May 1. We have an amazing group of teachers who provide excellent loving care to the children. Please spread the word about our awesome program!

Our Morning Out Mom Program also meets during the summer, maintaining regular hours except for a few weeks "vacation" in late July and early August. This program is for children walking through age three. Various donation rates help to cover some of the cost of the program. Two amazing caretakers provide a loving and Christian environment for the little ones. New friends are welcome to join us anytime during the year.



Our Vacation Bible School program is our big summertime fun program for the children of the church. This year the theme is *Everest - Conquering Challenges with God's Mighty Power*. We will meet June 14-18 from 6:15-8:30 p.m. The children enjoy music, Bible story, crafts, snacks, games, and movie adventures. Over 60 volunteers are needed during the week to run the various stations and lead the groups. Snacks and craft supplies are donated from the congregation. We typically have around 80 children in attendance each night.

Our Summer Sunday School program also meets during the summer. We typically combine all of the children into one learning class, due to vacation schedules.

SUNDAY WORSHIP SCHEDULE

At 8:50 a.m., members and friends of First Presbyterian Church are invited to attend The



Gathering. This service is held in the sanctuary. The piano is the primary instrument for leading in congregational music with a variety of instruments adding special touches from week to week. The prayers in worship and the flow of the service help the congregation gather in God's love. The Gathering ordinarily lasts 50 minutes and will conclude with the Benediction at 9:40 a.m.

At 11:00 a.m., you are invited to attend our later morning worship. This service is held in the sanctuary with music and responses regularly led by our chancel choir and accompanied by organ and piano. In the tradition of our church, cultivated over the last few decades, a full liturgy gives the congregation opportunities for spiritual enrichment and the sense of God's love and grace. This worship service ordinarily lasts one hour and concludes with the Benediction at 12:00 p.m.


