Second Sunday of Advent



Advent is the season of preparation for the celebration of Christmas, covering Sundays. This year, we will be focusing our worship on "A Season of Symbols." The sermons for the first three Sundays will focus on Old Testament symbols that paved the way for the birth of Christ. On the fourth Sunday (at a single morning worship service) our Chancel Choir will share a cantata encompassing several more symbols of the season.

Christmas Eve Worship Schedule

We hope you will join us for worship on one of the holiest nights of the year. For Christmas Eve, Sunday, December 24, we will have two opportunities for worship. Both of these worship services will help us to focus on the celebration of our Savior's birth with the reading of the biblical story, the singing of traditional carols, music from our Chancel Choir, and other ensembles, and closing with candlelight.



The 5:00 p.m. Candlelight Service of Lessons and Carols will also include musical selections from our Children's Choirs, and a children's story which includes a reenactment of the nativity story.

The 9:00 p.m. Candlelight Service of Lessons and Carols will feature additional musical selections from our Chancel Choir.




CIRCLE MEETINGS

Fifth Sunday First Pres Family Gathering December 31st.



We hope you will join us for this great day of faith, friendship, and fellowship on December 31.





The Chancel Choir, Youth, and children will have a special Christmas gift for you on Christmas Eve. They have been working on "Images of Adoration, Reflections of Christ in Symbols of the Season", a Christmas Cantata by Pepper Choplin. They will be presenting this cantata on Christmas Eve morning at the single 10:00 a.m. service. Mr. Choplin has become one of my favorite choral composers over the last few years because his writing seems to be centered on the message he wants people to hear through his music.

The publisher describes the cantata accurately: "We all enjoy the beauty of Christmas – the music and candles, the greenery and crimson flowers, the holy symbols of the manger, the star. These symbols are not merely decorations of the season. Their presence draws us into the story of Christmas each year, reminding us of the power, simplicity, and the awesome significance of the birth of the Christ Child." (Lorenz, 2014) The music joins several different styles combining new melodies with cherished hymns. I am delighted that we will have the children and youth join the adult choir for several of the songs and narration throughout the cantata.

A traditional worship service is held in our chapel. The service follows the same order as the 11:00 a.m. worship, does not have a Chancel Choir. Musical ensembles offer special music on many Sundays. A Time with Younger Disciples is included when we have children in attendance.

9:30 - 10:25 a.m. Heart of Worship

A Praise and Worship service is held in our sanctuary. Along with scripture, sermon, and prayers, a praise band helps the congregation in adoring and showing reverence to God. Following the Time with Younger Disciples, children are invited to join Ms. Lynn in music and then to join in their own Children's Sunday School Classes.

We are planning to share another wonderful Christmas Day meal for those in our area who are hungry. The dinner menu will include: turkey and gravy, ham, mashed potatoes, green bean casserole, corn, cranberry sauce, bread, pie, cake, and Christmas cookies. From 1:30–3:15 p.m. we will be cooking side dishes, carving meat, cutting bread and desserts in the main church kitchen, and setting up the 737 building and tables for the meal. We will serve from 3:30–4:30 p.m.
