

The members of our youth groups will help organize the cans, and fill out the detailed donation form that must be processed by the Department of Corrections. Once we have collected all of your partially filled paint cans, Dr. Negley and Chaplain Al-Khatib will deliver the paint to the prison.


9:30 - 10:25 a.m. ~ Heart of Worship
