THE SEASON OF LENT BEGINS AT FIRST PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH.



Ash Wednesday was the official start of the season of Lent (a forty day period of self-examination as Christians move with Jesus toward the cross and Easter.) We will mark the First Sunday of Lent on Sunday, February 22, by celebrating the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper at both the 8:50 a.m. Gathering, and the 11:00 a.m. Later Morning Worship Service. Prepare yourself to come to Christ's Table as a first step in this year's Lenten journey.

During the season of Lent, Dr. Negley and Dr. Interim Choir Director Harvey will be preaching through the Gospel According to John. As the weeks unfold, we will Interim Organist focus on Jesus as the object of our faith (John 1:19-Ronda A. Lacy 4:54); witness Christ's conflict with unbelievers Director of Finance & (John, chapters 5-12); enjoy Jesus' fellowship with followers (John, chapters 13-17); remember His death, resurrection, and events which followed (John, chapters 18-21). Bring your Bible, and join us each week in worship as we experience again the life-changing power of Christ's presence.




PLAYGROUND PICNIC IS BACK

Generosity Shows in our Christian Education Programs

Every week we offer Sunday School classes for children, youth, and adults. The preschool children have their very own class, while the elementary aged children experience the workshop rotation model. The Youth of the church meet in the Student Center for their class while the adults have three different classes to choose from. The children and youth meet from 9:45-10:45 a.m. while the adults meet from 10-10:45 a.m. on Sunday mornings.

On Wednesday afternoons we offer our Christ Kids program for children ages four through fifth grade. We have around 30 children attend this program. On Wednesday evenings the Middle School youth meet from 5:30 -7:30 p.m. in the Student Center. On Sunday evenings, the High School youth meet from 5:30 - 7:30 p.m. in the Student Center.



Our Morning out Mom program runs year round on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays from 8:45 a.m. - 1 p.m. for children walking through age 3.

During the summer we offer Kidz Summer Escape which is a six week long program, meeting 2 days a week for children ages three through kindergarten graduates. We also offer our Vacation Bible School program every summer for children ages four through fifth grade graduates. The dates this year are June 14-18, 2015 from 6:15-8:30 p.m. The theme will be *Everest - Conquering Challenges with God's Mighty Power*.



Once a year, all church members and friends are invited to attend the All Church Retreat at Cedarkirk. This is a Saturday and Sunday event where we have group Bible study, fellowship, outdoor fun, and a wonderful time together sharing in God's love.

Every Fall we have the Fall Fest the Wednesday before Halloween to celebrate with our church family. The children of the church dress up and play games during this event.

The Tuesday before Lent begins, we come together for Shrove Tuesday, our pancake supper and celebration.

We offer Family Nights and Playground Picnics once a month during the school year. We gather together either in McLeod Hall, The Geneva Room, or off-site for a time of food and fellowship.

At 8:50 a.m., members and friends of First Presbyterian Church are invited to attend The





The prayers in worship and the flow of the service help the congregation gather in God's love. The Gathering ordinarily lasts 50 minutes and will conclude with the Benediction at 9:40 a.m.

At 11:00 a.m., you are invited to attend our later morning worship. This service is held in the sanctuary with music and responses regularly led by our chancel choir and accompanied by organ and piano. In the tradition of our church, cultivated over the last few decades, a full liturgy gives the congregation opportunities for spiritual enrichment and the sense of God's love and grace. This worship service ordinarily lasts one hour and concludes with the Benediction at 12:00 p.m.

Children ages three and four gather in Room 108 for their own Sunday School time of crafts, snack, Bible lesson, and fun.




