


GOOD NEWS FOR GOD'S CHILDREN...

Generosity Shows in Memorial Gifts

Generosity Shows in the ministry of the church of Jesus Christ in many different ways. The regular weekly tithes and offerings of the members of a church enable a great deal of God's work in the world. Gifts made in memory of loved ones and friends often help churches to accomplish special tasks.

In the past few years, several generous memorial gifts have enhanced our Youth Ministry program here at First Pres.

For nearly a decade, the building at 711 Sixth Street NW has been the home to our Middle School and High School Youth Groups. The continued growth of our youth programs, and the small rooms in this 1930's vintage house, had created a problem for adequately hosting our youth meetings. (Twenty five plus middle schoolers trying to eat and study in a small space was not ideal.) Elder and church member Janet Golden left a significant gift in her will to First Presbyterian Church. Knowing the passion Janet, her sister Carol Anne, and the entire Golden family shared for the education of children and youth, the Session voted to tithe off Janet's gift, and renovate the building at 711 Sixth Street, renaming it "The Golden Center for Youth Ministry." By removing several interior walls, the Golden Center boasts a 1000 square foot main room. Two remodeled restrooms, and several smaller break-out rooms have made this a wonderfully functional home for our Middle School and High School Youth Ministries.



The wonderful deck that sits under the trees between our Student Ministry Building and the church playground is home to many youth group meals on Wednesday and Sunday evenings. This deck was constructed by family and friends, in memory of Mary Marmion Gray, who was instrumental in the education of children and youth in our congregation and community.



The vonHahmann family currently has their third child (Kyle) deeply involved in our youth ministry program. (Older siblings Kenneth and Kassady are proud alums of our youth groups.) Realizing how vital our weekly meals are in each youth group meeting, Karl, Randy (and Karla) vonHahmann undertook the complete renovation of the kitchen in the Golden Center in memory of their father, Max vonHahmann. The structural and cosmetic transformation of a formerly out-dated kitchen, complete with flooring, countertops, and new appliances were generously provided through this memorial gift.



We celebrate the memories of Max vonHahmann, Mary Gray, and Janet, Carol Anne, Elizabeth and Raymond Golden, and the generosity of their families and friends, as we dedicate our youth ministry complex to God's glory and our ministry with and for the youth of First Presbyterian Church.
