Creating the Lenten Banners ~ An Artist's Statement

The Lenten Banners (paper cuts) are done on white photographer's background paper. It is heavy in weight and comes in many large format sizes. This one is actually one of the smaller sizes, being 4'5" wide. Our panels are 10' long. The color behind the cutouts is called a non-woven fabric. It's kind of a cross between paper & fabric. When I was a kid we called it "magic paper" because it could be washed & used for cleaning cloths. This texture is often found in shopping bags now. The use of color behind the cutouts was done because of the roundels on the wall behind them. Most artists who do these large cut paper designs hang them freely from the ceilings. Since we had a different space to use, it seemed to me that the liturgical color of the season would be right.

In consultation with the Worship and Music Committee, I devised a 3 part series of banners, but knew I would need help with the hanging (engineering) part. That's where Steve Negley, Ross Kosmensky, and Sam Bryant came in. I am so grateful for their leadership in that role.

As I drew, and revised drawings, I soon realized that I didn't want to remove the Lenten portion (the cross seen from above, with the crown of thorns, and the shroud) even when the Easter portion was to be displayed. Easter IS joyous, and I chose to express it with huge Easter lilies, three of them, representing our triune God. But I didn't want us to loose sight of the Cross. I didn't want us to forget what Christ did for us. Did for me. Did for you. So I planned to only cover up 2/3 of the first banner, allowing enough to be seen so others would know it was intentional. The Easter banner would be backed with a bright, joyful yellow, and echo the beautiful display of real lilies in the sanctuary.

Bright Sunday has become an important tradition in our congregation. This had to be a part of the banner series too. So the drawings moved on to another 1/3, but still not covering the cross and the purple. Butterflies taking flight upward was the choice I made because of their symbolism with rebirth and joy, and again echoing other elements in the sanctuary. In consultation with Alan Harvey, it was decided not to go with a solid color but rather to paint in a random manner using pastel colors with liquid watercolor. I did paint the two panels next to each other (in my garage) so they would continue the symmetrical design, but I did not intend to paint color for each butterfly separately. Again, it is a background behind the paper cuts. (Much to my husband Len's disapproval at first.)

The transferring of design from a 9" x 12" sketch book to a 4 1/2' x 10' canvas (paper) does take a large space and a large straight edge/ruler. (Thank you, Sam.) I used the floor in the big Sunday School room, measuring on my hands and knees, then fastened a pencil to a yard stick and drew standing up in sock feet on the large paper. It worked. After I had drawn one it went to committee (true Presbyterian style) for cutting. Next the committee people traced it on another paper of equal size, marked "x's" so they knew which parts were to disappear, and cut the second one. When cut, the only other step was to attach the backing fabric. We used rubber cement, but only enough to hold it together. I still like the feeling of movement in the art works. Care had to be taken to flip the second cutout so it would be a reflection of the first when hung.

My big thanks to all those "Cut-Ups" who joyfully gave their time to help make this expression of faith possible. They are the Art Choir. And their names are: Heather Whitney, Donna Pollard, Brenda Darte, Nancy Shaw, Beth Luxford, Linda Stavres, Sue Henry, Sharon Mitchell, Cheryl Price, Lyn Swart, Margaret Braun, Lydia Rennie, Sarah Rennie, Sue McClew, Lynn McCoy. Thank you so much. You are the nucleus of a new Art in the Church committee!

At the appropriate time, after Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and before Bright Sunday, the hanging crew began their magic. Remember that the movie screens also are being used each Sunday, so we had to be sure that nothing was going to catch and tear as they were raised and lowered. And most of you probably wouldn't know about little secret rooms up above the two double doors at the front of the sanctuary, the one on the left being accessed by crossing over ABOVE the choir loft! These are the spaces where Steve and Sam used winches to pull up the banner simultaneously so it wouldn't lean too much to one side. Of course there were a lot of people on the floor in the sanctuary yelling instructions to them! Allen, Lynn, Amy McKee, and me! We are grateful.

It is our hope that these pieces will be able to be stored loosely rolled up and used again. It is also possible, should they become too ratty, to trace them again, or do something else with them.

Thank you to the Worship and Music Committee for allowing me to begin to share the gift that God has given to me with the congregation of First Presbyterian Church of Winter Haven. And thank you to each of the individuals who have spoken with me about your interest and excitement in the project. Your love overwhelms me. I look forward to working more with you on several other expressions of faith

Preschool Children will meet in Room 108 for a morning of crafts, snacks, Bible stories, and playtime with their preschool friends.





What began as a series of 'talks' on the radio by the devout Christian layman and brilliant college professor C. S. Lewis, has become a foundational book for many millions of Christ's followers over the years. "Ever since I became a Christian I have thought that the best, perhaps the only, service I could do for my unbelieving neighbors was to explain and defend the belief that has been common to nearly all Christians at all times." So Lewis begins this literary journey. Our class will read (five to ten pages a week) and reflect on Lewis' **Mere Christianity (What One Must Believe to be a Christian)**. If you have read this work before, come and share what elements in our faith has touched your heart and soul. If you have not had the opportunity, join with us for the first time as we explore topics such as The Three Parts of Morality, Christian Marriage, Forgiveness, Faith, Hope, Charity, Obstinate Toy Soldiers, Nice People or New Men, from the fertile and faithful perspective of C.S. Lewis. Dr. Negley will lead the class which meets in the back section of McLeod Hall.



COME WORSHIP WITH US

At **8:50 a.m.**, members and friends of First Presbyterian Church are invited to attend The Gathering. This service is held in the sanctuary. The piano is the primary instrument for leading in congregational music with a variety of instruments adding special touches from week to week. The prayers in worship and the flow of the service help the congregation gather in God's love. The Gathering ordinarily lasts 50 minutes and will conclude with the Benediction at 9:40 a.m.
