Thank you for helping us stay in touch with the congregation.


#### FINAL CALL FOR PRAYER CHAIN VOLUNTEERS

## Generosity Shows in Special Gifts and Weekly Offerings

The Mission Team rolled out of the driveway at 637 Sixth Street NW before sunrise one morning last summer, on their way to Miami to catch a flight to Honduras. At the end of a fabulous week there in ministry, even with the somewhat unpredictable departure schedule on their return trip, the team was confident that once they had touched down again in the US, the trusty church bus would be waiting to bring them back to Winter Haven.

The Lunch Bunch piled into the church bus and the new church mini-van (and another rented van, <u>and</u> three private cars graciously offered by church members) and headed toward their most recent destination – Margaritaville – for four hours of food, fun, and Christian fellowship.

The Middle School and High School Youth of First Presbyterian Church regularly fill the seats of church vehicles as they flock yards in their Flamingo Fundraiser, travel to Christian concerts at the Strawberry Festival or Rock the Universe, or enjoy their summer trips to Montreat or The Great Escape.

Our church owns and operates vehicles so that people of all ages can travel together in the service of our Lord Jesus Christ. And these vehicles show the generosity of the members and friends of First Presbyterian Church. A couple of years ago, we were able to purchase a 15 passenger mini-bus. The entry steps and middle aisle on this vehicle made it a perfect choice for use by all age groups in the church. Along with the proceeds from the sale of our older van and a transit bus which had been donated by a local bank, the majority of the purchase of the new bus was paid for through the generosity of two families within our congregation.

A few weeks ago, when our church's Lincoln Towncar (which had been donated to the church by two friends of our congregation out of their parents' estate) finally gave up the ghost, the Session agreed to replace this transportation workhorse with a late model 8 passenger mini-van. A family within our congregation donated one third of the purchase price, and the Session used the partial proceeds of a recurring gift that Paul and Jean Cate made to the church in their estate plans through the Community Foundation of Greater Winter Haven, to pay for the balance.

These generous special gifts have made it possible for our groups to get out and about in mission and ministry as we have two safe, reliable (paid-off) church vehicles at the disposal of all church groups. In the past twelve months, the travel log on our church bus shows the Presbyterian Women travelling to Disney for a luncheon; adults in the 10-to-2 Lunch Bunch dining in Tampa, Celebration, Lakeland and Orlando; youth attending events in North Carolina, Ocala, Orlando, and Cocoa Beach; and the Mission Team making it to Miami airport and back. And this doesn't reflect the monthly local excursions by church groups.

While the purchase of the two most recent vehicles has been accomplished largely through one-time gifts to the church, keeping these vehicles on the road is how generosity shows in the regular financial giving of our congregation. The tithes and offerings of our friends and members help to insure and maintain all our church facilities and equipment, so that we can engage in ministry where and when God calls. Thank you for your generous support of the ministry that we share here (and there) as Christ's church.

### DO YOU KNOW WHAT NEEDS TO HAPPEN BEFORE THE COMMUNION TRAYS ARE PASSED TO YOU?



The table must be covered with the under tablecloth. The bread must be cubed and put into plastic bags. The bread trays must be collected. The cups must be put in the holders of the trays and filled with grape juice. The bread, bread trays, and filled cup trays must be transported to the sanctuary as well as those prepared for the station from which the sacrament will be served in the balcony. The table must be set with these trays, the loaf of bread, the chalice, and the pitcher. Once these are in place the table is veiled.

After communion has been served for The Gathering Service at 8:50 a.m., there is tidying up and re-setting the table for the 11:00 a.m. service. Once communion has been served, the table must be cleared of all the trays, chalice, pitcher, and cloths. These are taken downstairs to be washed or cleaned and then returned to their storage places in the kitchen and elsewhere.

A lot happens before <u>and after</u> the communion trays are passed to you! We have a skeleton crew of faithful volunteers who serve you in this way, but <u>we need more!</u> Please consider this invitation to serve and if you feel that you are being called to assist in this important act of ministry, then please call Alan at the church office at 294-3121. At 8:50 a.m., members and friends of First Presbyterian Church are invited to attend The




