

SPRING RING THANK YOU!



Making FIRST PRES Your FIRST CHOICE in World Mission by Helping Hondurans

From June 11 – June 18, a twenty-three member mission team from our congregation will be serving God in the Central American country of Honduras. Honduras, the second poorest country in the Western Hemisphere, has been a mission focus for our church since the late 1990's. Through an international partnership between the Presbytery of Tampa Bay and the Presbytery of Honduras, we are working alongside Christian sisters and brothers in the 22 Presbyterian Churches in that country sharing the gospel of Jesus in Word and deed.

This year's mission team will be conducting one-day medical/dental clinics based in three churches of the Presbytery of Honduras.



We will also be painting the adobe exterior and supplying and installing a solar-powered lighting system at the most recently constructed church in their presbytery.



Each of our mission teams members has been asked to donate a week of their time and \$500 toward the cost of the trip. We are asking members of our congregation to pray for our trip and mission, and to consider joining us as partners in helping provide supplies for our work.



Please partner with our 2016 Mission Team by helping provide supplies: \$3000 for medicines (\$1000 for each one-day medical/dental clinic)

\$400 for paint/supplies for the sanctuary at Zuniga

\$650 for a solar powered lighting system for the Zuniga church

\$450 for school supplies for the schools in Zuniga and Puerto Grande

450 \$10 envelopes will cover these costs

Please enclose \$10.00 (cash, check, or coin) for one partnership

Partnership envelopes will be available in the narthex beginning Sunday, May 8. We are asking people to take an envelope, and fill it with \$10 (check, paper money, or change). We hope that children, youth, and adults alike will join us by filling one or more \$10 partnership envelopes. 450 partnerships will help us raise the \$4500 needed for medicine, painting materials, the solar-powered lighting system, and supplies for the schools in the villages we visit.






The Perspectives Class will continue their discussion on the book - *What Does the Lord Require? Doing Justice, Loving Kindness, Walking Humbly*, by James C. Howell. This class is led by Dr. Jim Threlkel and Mr. Glenn Thomas and meets in the Geneva Room, Room 106 of the CE Building.





Presenting a new small group study from City on a Hill Productions. Twenty times in the New Testament, Jesus issued a compelling and challenging invitation to Follow Him. He's not interested in mere fans. He doesn't want enthusiastic admirers. He wants Completely Committed Followers. Based on the engaging approach of Kyle Idleman, this one-of-a-kind small group study examines what it means to deny one's self and truly follow Jesus. Join us for "Not a Fan;" six DVD sessions with discussion in Room 207 of the Christian Education building. The class will be facilitated by Gannon Olmert. This class will meet April 17 – May 22.

What began as a series of 'talks' on the radio by the devout Christian layman and brilliant college professor C. S. Lewis, has become a foundational book for many millions of Christ's followers over the years. "Ever since I became a Christian I have thought that the best, perhaps the only, service I could do for my unbelieving neighbors was to explain and defend the belief that has been common to nearly all Christians at all times." So Lewis begins this literary journey. Our class will read (five to ten pages a week) and reflect on Lewis' **Mere Christianity (What One Must Believe to be a Christian)**. If you have read this work before, come and share what elements in our faith has touched your heart and soul. If you have not had the opportunity, join with us for the first time as we explore topics such as The Three Parts of Morality, Christian Marriage, Forgiveness, Faith, Hope, Charity, Obstinate Toy Soldiers, Nice People or New Men, from the fertile and faithful perspective of C.S. Lewis. Dr. Negley will lead the class which meets in the back section of McLeod Hall.



COME WORSHIP WITH US

At 8:50 a.m., members and friends of First Presbyterian Church are invited to attend The Gathering. This service is held in the sanctuary. The piano is the primary instrument for leading in congregational music with a variety of instruments adding special touches from week to week. The prayers in worship and the flow of the service help the congregation gather in God's love. The Gathering ordinarily lasts 50 minutes and will conclude with the Benediction at 9:40 a.m.



At 11:00 a.m., you are invited to attend our later morning worship. This service is held in the sanctuary with music and responses regularly led by our chancel choir and accompanied by organ and piano. In the tradition of our church, cultivated over the last few decades, a full liturgy gives the congregation opportunities for spiritual enrichment and the sense of God's love and grace. This worship service ordinarily lasts one hour and concludes with the Benediction at 12:00 p.m.

We hope you will join us in worship, study, and fellowship!



If you are a middle or high school student we would love for you to join us for youth group each week in our new and improved youth house, The Golden Center. We fed 80 people on 5/7/16




