

First Presbyterian Church of Winter Haven strives to fulfill that command in this community. And our light reaches far. It starts as close as delivering a loaf of bread and a current *Tower Chimes* to first time visitors, letting them know they were noticed and welcome. Our beams stretch further into our community to groups like, the Winter Haven Stamp Club, Alanon, the Winter Haven Quilters, Boy Scouts, and Girl Scouts just to name a few. Our light goes beyond our immediate community and even reaches to the ends of the earth with our website. With events like Come to the Stable and Bethlehem Square (our Living Nativity), the Jingle Java Jam, Christ Kids, and Morning Out Moms, we reach out to many people who live beyond our church walls. Yes, our light reaches out far, and it can reach even farther..

## The words in a children's song say: "The church is not a building, the church is not a steeple, the church is not a resting place, the church IS the people."

Here at First Presbyterian Church of Winter Haven the church IS the people. Our church is married couples and single adults. Our church is parents with young children and folks who have recently retired. Our church is children, youth, and young, middle and older adults. There are over 1,000 people who make First Presbyterian their church home. We are people who laugh together, cry together, and live together in faith.

A church whose heart is people, needs to keep ministry to people at heart. The Apostle **Paul reminds us in I Corinthians 12, that "When one member of the body suffers, all suffer together." Here at First Presbyterian Church we keep our personal focus through** the ministry of Congregational Care.

Our pastors make every effort to visit persons in the hospital to offer prayer and support, and to follow up with a visit to make sure folks are settling in at home. Our pastors and the lay people in our visitation ministry help care for our friends and members who are confined to nursing homes or their own homes. Our pastors respond to situations of loss and grief by trying to express the love of Christ through their words and presence. Our pastors work with other Stephen Leaders to help direct the personal and confidential caring ministry to individuals going through times of transition that our Stephen Ministers provide.

Our church's investment in the ministry of outreach for the year 2018 will include the costs of advertising and our website. Our church's investment in the ministry of inreach for the year 2018 will include the program expenses for our care ministries and costs related to having the services of a pastor and associate pastor. Thanks to the generously shared tithes and offerings of our member and friends, we will invest nearly \$200,000 in In-reach and Outreach Ministries. In addition, during 2018, our church members will donate over 2500 volunteer hours welcoming newcomers to our church, and reaching out as the cast for our Living Nativity Scene, and caring for our members as Stephen Ministers and Leaders, Friendship Callers, and Comfort Food chefs.

## SUNDAY SCHOOL FOR ALL AGES




