GENEROSITY SHOWS In Local mission

Through your generosity, our church has become known within the community as "the church that feeds the hungry." It is understandable how we came to acquire that name through our sponsoring a Saturday Soup Kitchen and our Bag Lunch Ministry.

Over the past year, each Saturday evening, volunteers from this church and others within the community contributed their time, skills, and resources to provide a hot meal to an average of 100 guests per night. We spent in excess of \$18,000 of the monies you contributed to our church's budget to feeding our hungry neighbors.

This past year, First Presbyterian Church has also distributed thousands of bag lunches - averaging over 60 bags given out each weekday. We expended over \$12,000 on this ministry alone. Your generosity with our needy neighbors is seen through your financial support of the church and through the many hours volunteers devote to assembling the bag lunches.

Another organization dedicated to feeding hungry people is our across the street neighbor, Meals on Wheels. A number of our members contribute their time to delivering these meals. We supported this organization through our Deacon's Fund. In addition, our Deacons support Anchor House, Family Emergency Services, and The Mission. Anchor House provides a foster home for boys needing a supervised and stable environment. Family Emergency Services and The Mission provide food, clothing, financial assistance with medications, rent, utilities, and assistance with job search and resume writing.

One of the most recent neighborhood organizations to which we have given financial support is the Angels Care Center located in Eloise. This center provides medical care to area residents who are uninsured and who cannot afford to pay.

Realizing the importance of nurturing boys to become fine men, our church has a long history with the Boy Scouts, providing facilities and financial support to Boy Scout Troop 121. Another organization with whom we have had a long association is Habitat for Humanity, which actually first had offices here in this church. We assist their work in providing affordable and decent housing for neighbors needing a helping hand.

> We support our mentally and physically challenged neighbors through our gifts to support the work of the Polk Training Center and to fund Saturday Nite Live. The

training center helps the students to acquire and develop horticultural and landscaping skills. Saturday Nite Live, which meets here on the third Saturday evenings September through May, provides an

opportunity for these neighbors and others within the community to have a time of fellowship.

In the past twelve months, the generosity of our congregation has shown as we have given over \$40,000 to local missions.



The Perspectives Class meets in the Geneva Room and is facilitated by Dr. Jim Threlkel and Glenn Thomas. They are focusing on Martin Thielen's book, What's the Least I Can Believe and Still Be A Christian? Everyone is invited to join in this thought-provoking discussion time. Pastor and author, Martin Thielen, has compiled a list of ten things people need to believe and ten things they don't, in order to be a Christian. This lively and engaging book will be a help to seekers as well as a comfort to believers who may find themselves questioning some of the assumptions they grew up with.

Dr. Steve Negley's class meets in the back of McLeod Hall. The topic is: Mastering the Basics in I John. This eight-week study will take the class on a journey through a little book (I John) tucked near the back of the New Testament. Long before C.S. Lewis and his look at "Mere" Christianity, a writer named John was putting pen to papyrus and helping early Christians explore the essential elements of their faith. Addressing a congregation where faith and practice had taken some wrong turns, John shared the good news of how things could move in the right direction. Bring your Bible and be prepared to explore how we can walk in the Light and walk in love; test the spirits and be aware of antichrists; live as children of God who love one another; and revel in how God's love inspires our love.
