

WORSHIP THROUGH MUSIC

Music for the very young Wednesday 10:45-11:15 & 11:15-11:45 (Drop-ins welcome at 10:45) Lynn does a special music class for the Morning Out Moms' children. Drop-ins are welcome to attend the music session. Singing, movement, pre-reading skills, story time, and playing a variety of non-pitched instruments makes music time fun. Traditional and contemporary children's Christian songs provide a wealth of resources.





Children Wednesday Christ Kids and Sunday School

Children from preschool through grade 5 participate in music activities using singing, instruments and movement. They regularly participate in the worship service with their offering of praise through song. They use a variety of percussion instruments, ukulele, guitar and recorders to encourage music reading and to develop their musical talents. There is also a Christ Kids Ringers ensemble for hand bells.

Youth Sunday 4:30

The Youth meet on Sunday prior to Youth group in the Golden Center. Any high school or middle school youth who are interested in singing or playing an instrument are invited to come and join. The Youth regularly share their praise with song during worship service. Resources include a variety of musical styles from classical to contemporary Christian. There are many opportunities to use your talents in a large group or small ensemble so come and join a great group of kids! High School youth are also invited to join the adult Chancel choir and Chancel and Chapel Bells.

Adult Chancel Choir meets on Wednesdays at 7:00 p.m. and Sunday a half hour before service. Anyone from high school age and up is welcome to join a wonderful fellowship of praise through song. There is no audition required. The Chancel Choir regularly sings at the 11:00 service and special events throughout the year. The Choir will be singing at the 2016 Jingle Java Jam in December, Disney Candlelight Processional, and this year we will present a joint concert with Haines City Presbyterian Church – stay tuned!



<u>Hand Bells</u>. We have two adult hand bell groups. Chancel Bells meets on **Wednesday at 6:00 p.m.** and Chapel Bells meets on **Thursday at 1:15 p.m.** High School through adult ages are welcome. Both groups play regularly for Sunday worship service and for special occasions. We have space for beginners and advanced ringers. You just need to make a commitment to the rehearsal schedule! We have a special Spring Ring planned for April 2017!



Praise and Worship Band. We have a new opportunity this year for those who are interested in playing or singing contemporary Christian music. There is weekly rehearsals on Thursdays at 6:30 p.m. and music will be shared at our Praise and Worship service on Sunday morning. Solo and Small Ensemble Voice/Instrumental opportunities

WORSHIP SERVICES

8:15 a.m. **Chapel Worship**

A traditional worship service held in our chapel. The service will follow the same order as the 11:00 a.m. worship, but will not have a Chancel Choir. Musical ensembles will offer special music on many Sundays. A Time with Younger Disciples will be included if we have children in attendance.

9:30 - 10:25 a.m. **Heart of Worship**

A Praise and Worship service held in our sanctuary. Along with scripture, sermon, and prayers, a praise band will help the congregation in adoring and showing reverence to God. Following the Time with Younger Disciples, children will be invited to join Ms. Lynn in music and then to join in their own Children's Sunday School Classes.

11:00 a.m. **Sanctuary Worship**

A traditional worship service held in our sanctuary. The service follows the same order as the 8:15 a.m. Chapel Service, and includes music from the Chancel Choir and the organ, as well as other instruments and groups.


THE CONNECTION 9:15 – 10:45 a.m.
