OM, OM BOOK CLUB


The next meeting of the OM, OM Book Club is **Monday**, **November 21 at 3 pm** in the back of McLeod Hall.

We will be holding a training session so **contact Lynn at 701-570-1485** and let her know if you are willing to join the Sunday rotation in the sound booth.



COMMUNION TO THE FURTHEST PEW RECAP

As readers of the bulletins and Tower Chimes, you no doubt saw the article on the **Communion to the Furthest Pew** that appeared in editions leading up to World Communion Sunday October 2. This new initiative suggested by the Community Outreach Committee and approved by Session was to offer the Lord's Supper on an organized regular basis to those who are homebound or confined to health care facilities. It is a new program and we had only one request this time, but pastor, elder and recipients were moved by this celebration.

On Tuesday October 4, Associate Pastor Alan Harvey and Elder Ellen Zeller took communion to new members Ann and Jack Meadows at Palm Garden Rehab Center. On a secluded porch gathered around a table we became better acquainted with one another and felt the Spirit's presence as we shared the sacrament in a brief service. Ellen remarked, "The initial visit to a couple at Palm Garden on Tuesday was a mini communion service that very meaningful to all participants." Ann and Jack were most appreciative and agreed to be photographed to encourage others to participate in future celebrations of Communion to the Furthest Pew.



The next time for Communion to the Furthest Pew will follow the church's celebration of the sacrament on Sunday March 5, 2017, and extending through Friday March 10. Look for notices in the Tower Chimes and the bulletins a few weeks ahead of that time for **members** to phone in your request to receive the Lord's Supper and for **officers** to join ministers in the homebound celebration of Holy Communion.



WORSHIP THROUGH MUSIC

Music for the very young Wednesday 10:45-11:15 & 11:15-11:45 (Drop-ins welcome at 10:45) Lynn does a special music class for the Morning Out Moms' children. Drop-ins are welcome to attend the music session. Singing, movement, pre-reading skills, story time, and playing a variety of non-pitched instruments makes music time fun. Traditional and contemporary children's Christian songs provide a wealth of resources.





Children Wednesday Christ Kids and Sunday School

Children from preschool through grade 5 participate in music activities using singing, instruments and movement. They regularly participate in the worship service with their offering of praise through song. They use a variety of percussion instruments, ukulele, guitar and recorders to encourage music reading and to develop their musical talents. There is also a Christ Kids Ringers ensemble for hand bells.

Youth Sunday 4:30

The Youth meet on Sunday prior to Youth group in the Golden Center. Any high school or middle school youth who are interested in singing or playing an instrument are invited to come and join. The Youth regularly share their praise with song during worship service. Resources include a variety of musical styles from classical to contemporary Christian. There are many opportunities to use your talents in a large group or small ensemble so come and join a great group of kids! High School youth are also invited to join the adult Chancel choir and Chancel and Chapel Bells.

Adult Chancel Choir meets on Wednesdays at 7:00 p.m. and Sunday a half hour before service. Anyone from high school age and up is welcome to join a wonderful fellowship of praise through song. There is no audition required. The Chancel Choir regularly sings at the 11:00 service and special events throughout the year. The Choir will be singing at the 2016 Jingle Java Jam in December, Disney Candlelight Processional, and this year we will present a joint concert with Haines City Presbyterian Church – stay tuned!



<u>Hand Bells.</u> We have two adult hand bell groups. Chancel Bells meets on **Wednesday at 6:00 p.m.** and Chapel Bells meets on **Thursday at 1:15 p.m.** High School through adult ages are welcome. Both groups play regularly for Sunday worship service and for special occasions. We have space for beginners and advanced ringers. You just need to make a commitment to the rehearsal schedule! We have a special Spring Ring planned for April 2017!



<u>Praise and Worship Band.</u> We have a new opportunity this year for those who are interested in playing or singing contemporary Christian music. There is weekly rehearsals on Thursdays at 6:30 p.m. and music will be shared at our Praise and Worship service on Sunday morning. Please contact Lynn if you are interested in joining this group on a regular or drop-in basis. This is a new and exciting opportunity for musicians in our church.

Solo and Small Ensemble Voice/Instrumental opportunities

If you are a youth with 3 years band experience or an adult who used to play, and any singers who are unable to commit to regular choir rehearsals, we would love to have you join one of our small music ensembles. We use piano, keyboard or organ in every service and we welcome and encourage those with keyboard skills.

WORSHIP SERVICES

8:15 a.m. **Chapel Worship**

A traditional worship service held in our chapel. The service will follow the same order as the 11:00 a.m. worship, but will not have a Chancel Choir. Musical ensembles will offer special music on many Sundays. A Time with Younger Disciples will be included if we have children in attendance.

9:30 - 10:25 a.m. **Heart of Worship**

A Praise and Worship service held in our sanctuary. Along with scripture, sermon, and prayers, a praise band will help the congregation in adoring and showing reverence to God. Following the Time with Younger Disciples, children will be invited to join Ms. Lynn in music and then to join in their own Children's Sunday School Classes.

11:00 a.m. **Sanctuary Worship**


