




## OM, OM BOOK **DISCUSSION CLUB IS** GETTING CLOSER

## Generosity Shows in How We Work Together at First Pres ---

First Presbyterian Church of Winter Haven operates with a unified church budget. This means that the ministry that we conduct through all our program areas falls under a single church budget, which is supported by the tithes and offerings of our members. **Every person** who gives in support of this budget **is a partner in everything** that we do, from preaching to teaching, to the care of our own children in the nursery and the children in Honduras through international mission.

The beauty of a unified budget rests in the fact the Session makes decisions of overall significance, so that each area of ministry can function without the constant concern of how to raise funds for items which are common to and crucial for the overall life of Christ's church here. (e.g. The *worship and music area* can stay focused on God -directed worship and inspiring music, rather than trying to pay the utilities so that there were be lights and air-conditioning on Sundays, to raise money to maintain instruments, or take bulletins out for printing. The *youth program* can focus on ministry with and for young people, rather than having to raise money for the salary of the youth director, or pitching a tent each week for a meeting place. etc.)

In our 2015 operating budget, the extent to which we shared resources so that the church can be the church is revealed. Facilities operations and maintenance represents \$236,000 of our budget. (This is monitored by the Buildings and Grounds and Personnel Committees.) That means that providing space for all that we do, insuring, and appropriately maintaining that space costs \$19,600 a month just so that we can all share in

ministry here.













Our church is blessed by wonderful physical resources for ministry.

Our sanctuary building provides two wonderful spaces for the worship of God: our sanctuary (with a seating capacity of 700) and our chapel (for weddings, funerals and other events for groups of 80 or smaller). The sanctuary building also houses our kitchen, McLeod Hall, the church offices, the Price and Spencer Libraries, the Music Suite, and various meeting rooms.



The Helen Haines Christian Education Building is the nerve-center for our educational programs. The Nursery Suite, our Rotation Workshop Centers, the Children's Library, Children's Worship Center, The New Children's Music Room, Enrichment Room, Teacher Resource Center, and various adult classrooms fill the





The GOLDEN CENTER FOR STUDENT MINISTRY (at 711 Sixth Street, NW) is home for our Middle School Youth, Senior High Youth on Sundays and throughout the week.

The Recreation and Community Service Building at 737 Sixth Street, NW allows us to have covered recreation for our children and youth, a shop and storage for our maintenance director, and community outreach programs such as the Saturday Soup Kitchen and Saturday Nite Live.

A unified church budget is all about partnership, as each member of the church shares as a partner in the overall ministry of the church. (No one person can take sole credit for the sharing of faith or the works of charity, leaving someone else responsible for the sidewalks and sewer lines.) Each time any of us drops a dollar in the plate, we have helped every area of ministry.



As we continue serving Christ in 2015, our ministry will prosper as each member and friends of our church adds generously to the ministry that we share. Thanks for helping us provide a place and a program where God is praised.
