



FAQs about "Communion to the Furthest Pew"



1. What is "Communion to the Furthest Pew"?

This is an organized program, conceived by the Community Outreach Committee and the Deacons and approved by the Session, to schedule and implement serving the Lord's Supper to those who are homebound or confined to long term health care facilities.

2. When will "Communion to the Furthest Pew" begin?

We plan to initiate the program beginning on Sunday October 2, World Communion Sunday. The week following a Sunday worship service with Holy Communion, a minister accompanied by a past or currently serving elder or deacon will make a visit to members confined to home or a health care facility who have requested the sacrament. The goal is to administer "Communion to the Furthest Pew" three to four times a year following a Communion service on the church's worship calendar. Along with World Communion Sunday, other dates being considered are: the First Sunday in Lent and Pentecost.

3. How does one request receiving "Communion to the Furthest Pew"?

Please call the Church Office at 294-3121 to let us know of your desire and ask that your name be placed on the list. A minister will return your call to find a time convenient for him and an active or inactive church officer to visit and serve Holy Communion to you.

4. How do active or inactive church officers volunteer to assist with this important and meaningful ministry?

Several weeks before a Communion Sunday, notices will be placed in the bulletin and Tower Chimes recruiting officers to volunteer to assist with *Communion to the Furthest Pew*. Please call one of the church's ministers at 294-3121 to let him know of your desire and availability to accompany him or another minister in making these visits. Steve, Alan or Ray will be glad to learn of your willingness to assist and add your name to the schedule.

5. What should I/we expect when the Lord's Supper is brought to me/us?

A minister and an elder or deacon will come to your home or the health care facility at an agreed upon time. They will bring the bread and juice. The minister will offer a prayer, read some scripture and do a brief reflection before Holy Communion is served. Each visit should be 20 minutes to less than a half hour in length.

6. Why is it necessary for a church officer to accompany the minister?

According to our church's policy, neither of the sacraments, Baptism or Holy Communion is to be a private act, but one administered by and for the church. Therefore, an elder or deacon accompanies the minister and represents the church at a "home" communion.

7. Will it just be the three of us?

If a spouse or child is present at the home or facility, then certainly the invitation to receive the sacrament will be extended to them. Also, if there are several members confined to one facility, the pastor might contact the administrators to see if a room might be available for a small service of Holy Communion rather than being done in several individual rooms. In such situations, that service might resemble a "mini" church service of several members being gathered together. In any case, the minister will need to be informed of the "extras" ahead of time so that the necessary arrangements and provisions can be made.

STARTING SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 18 here's what you'll find each Sunday morning!



8:15 a.m. Chapel Worship

A traditional worship service held in our chapel. The service will follow the same order as the 11:00 a.m. worship, but will not have a Chancel Choir. Musical ensembles will offer special music on many Sundays. A Time with Younger Disciples will be included if we have children in attendance.

9:15 – 10:45 a.m. The Connection

An extended fellowship time in McLeod Hall which will offer a coffee bar type selection with different flavors, creamers, pastries, etc. It will be a gathering place before (or after) worship, and between worship and Sunday School for some. Videos of church activities will be playing on a loop in McLeod Hall. Hosts will circulate in McLeod Hall and the CE Building to greet and assist people in making connections with others in one of the worship or Christian Education options.

9:30 – 10:45 a.m. Adult Sunday School

A variety of Christian Education classes for adults. (Pre-care will be offered from 9:30 – 9:45 a.m. for the children of parents attending adult Sunday School. Church school staff/volunteers will escort pre-care children to music at 9:45 a.m.)

9:45 – 10:45 a.m. Children's Sunday School

We will begin with music with Ms. Lynn at 9:45 a.m. and then children of all ages will be welcomed to explore faith in their own classes

9:30 - 10:25 a.m. Heart of Worship

A Praise and Worship service held in our sanctuary. Along with scripture, sermon, and prayers, a praise band will help the congregation in adoring and showing reverence to God. Following the Time with Younger Disciples, children will be invited to join Ms. Lynn in music and then to join in their own Children's Sunday School Classes.

11:00 a.m. Sanctuary Worship

A traditional worship service held in our sanctuary. The service follows the same order as the 8:15 a.m. Chapel Service, and includes music from the Chancel Choir and the organ, as well as other instruments and groups.
